#### **POSITION**

Invasive species technicians (3) are needed to assist with early detection rapid response (EDRR) and treatment efforts of priority invasive plant species on Fort Drum, New York. Incumbents will be employed by Colorado State University's Center for Environmental Management of Military Lands (CSU CEMML).

#### **ORGANIZATION**

CEMML is a research, education and service unit within the Warner College of Natural Resources at Colorado State University (CSU). CEMML applies the latest and most appropriate science to promote the sustainable management of natural and cultural resources on Department of Defense (DoD) and other public lands. We provide technical support, conduct applied research, and offer career development and learning opportunities to support resource stewardship. #### **LOCATION**

Fort Drum, New York. Fort Drum is a United States Army installation 10 miles northeast of Watertown, New York and in close proximity to Canada, the Thousand Islands, and the Adirondack Park.

#### **PRIMARY DUTIES**

Technicians will help identify and map invasive plant populations. They will also help treat historically known infestations. Mechanical, chemical, and biological treatments will be implemented to different invasive populations according to their size and location.

#### **QUALIFICATIONS**

Technicians should have least an AS or AAS degree or upper division standing in botany, biology, ecology, natural sciences or related field. A BS/BA degree and/or vegetation identification or botanical fieldwork is preferred, but not required. A valid driver's license is required. Having at least a New York State Pesticide technician certificate is optimal. If the employee candidate does not have one then they must be willing to complete the training and go through the steps necessary to obtain one. Ability to use a map and compass will be beneficial. Applicants should be in good physical condition and willing to work extended periods of time in all types of weather and habitat conditions. Long hours of carrying a 4 gallon

backpack sprayer on a regular basis is to be expected. Cutting invasive species while wearing a harness with a 20 pound brush saw will also be required of applicants. A working knowledge of Global Positioning Systems (GPS) is a plus.

### **BACKGROUND CHECK**

Colorado State University is committed to providing a safe and productive learning and living community. To achieve that goal, we conduct background investigations for all final candidates being considered for employment. Background checks may include, but are not limited to, criminal history, national sex offender search and motor vehicle history.

### **WAGES**

\$19.50/hour, depending on qualifications and experience. Housing is not provided.
