Position Summary

Forest Planning Internship with the Center for Environmental Management of Military Lands (CEMML) Early-Career Development Program (ECDP). The Forestry Technician will assist with forest planning and modeling for the Joint Base Lewis McChord (JBLM) Forestry program. The program has a complete tree inventory and needs support to extract forest metrics such as average height, average diameter, and gross volume from management units using the Forest Vegetation Simulator (FVS) to prepare for upcoming timber sales. This position will also perform carbon accounting of forestry-related management actions to aid in timber harvest planning. Schedule is negotiable. Since this position is in support of Joint Base Lewis-McChord but located in Fort Collins, a trip may be required to the installation.

Installation/Location Summary

The main offices of the Center for Environmental Management of Military Lands (CEMML) are based on the campus of Colorado State University in Fort Collins, CO. Located in Northern Colorado about an hour north of Denver and a 45-minute drive south of Cheyenne, Wyoming, Fort Collins is consistently awarded one of the top places to live in the United States. The area is a perfect mix of city life and mountain accessibility.

Joint Base Lewis-McChord (JBLM) is located 9.1 miles south-southwest of Tacoma, Washington, and is a training and mobilization center for all services and is the only Army power projection base west of the Rocky Mountains. The facility is under the U.S. Army Joint Base Garrison and includes the U.S. Army's Fort Lewis and the U.S. Air Force's McChord Air Force Base. JBLM is 90,000 acres with one of the largest remaining intact forest areas in the Puget Sound basin.
